Looking to the Future

After months of the COVID-19 shutdown, our schools and our city began taking the first steps toward a return to something like normal in June.

In a normal summer, this is the space where we'd update you on graduation and the spring season in sports and the arts. None of those things happened, of

course. Schools were shut down March 13, everything from the spring sports season to the spring musical to prom was canceled, and our newest alumni missed out on many of the traditions of being a senior at East. The district still hopes to have some form of in-person graduation August 6, but those plans--like all plans in 2020--are tentative.

So instead of looking back, we're looking ahead. In just a couple of months, school will start up again. New students will be welcomed at Breton Downs, Lakeside and Wealthy Elementary. Sixth graders from around the district will come together at the Middle School. And a new class of Pioneers will enter the High School.

Those students could use your help. The shutdown has caused a \$2.85 million budget deficit for our schools. The district has already recommended \$1.25 million in cuts, and the Board of Education has asked the district to recommend more. Those additional cuts may be necessary to keep the district solvent, and eliminate the possibility of the state taking control of our schools.

Some of the cuts being considered would fundamentally change the East educational experience. The Board of Education doesn't want to do that, but without help, that may be necessary. It's up to us.

Working to Save Our Schools Before July 31 Budget Deadline

An unprecedented challenge demands an unprecedented response.

Because of COVID-19, our East Grand Rapids school district is facing a \$2.85 million deficit.

We can help.

The Foundation is organizing <u>One East</u>, a community-wide, coordinated fundraising effort so every dollar raised by school entities this summer supports programs in our district that are in danger of being cut. One East is bringing together organizations, students and families at all our schools to protect the East Grand Rapids Public Schools' Tradition of Excellence.

More than 62% of school funding comes from sales & income taxes—not property taxes! Covid-19 has caused a school funding shortfall greater than the one during the Great Recession. Schools across Michigan will be impacted, but together, we can lessen the blow here at home through One East.

Any contribution to One East will make a difference. We're trying to raise \$653 per student by July 31 to offset the \$653 per pupil state budget cut for 2020-21. That's \$653 so a child can learn to read and write, so a child can learn another language or learn to code, so a child can play a sport or an instrument and prepare to play a part in the future of our world.

Foundation Connection: The East Grand Rapids Schools Foundation will contribute more than \$330,000 to our schools this year--including a one-time 20 percent increase in the maximum amount that can be drawn from the Foundation's endowment--but that won't be enough.


Gerken Open Pushed Back Until October 5
