

Buildings Closed for the Rest of the School Year, but Community Rallies Around Our Students

The decision to close school buildings and suspend face-to-face learning through the end of the school year for all public school districts in Michigan due to the Covid-19 crisis was met with sadness in East Grand Rapids. As all East alumni know, our schools are at the heart of our community so their closing leaves a void this spring. The closing is particularly disappointing for this year's seniors, who may miss out on many of the rites of passage our alumni have enjoyed.

Even before the announcement, however, East residents found ways to support and encourage each other. Kids created sidewalk chalk messages like the one shown here, neighbors made signs to thank medical workers who met the challenges at Blodgett hospital, and families came up with ingenious ways to stay connected even when we have to be apart.



Foundation Grant Helps Send Middle Schoolers to See "Hamilton" in Grand Rapids

Thanks to our donors, a grant funded by the Foundation helped all the 8th graders at EGRMS see the mega-hit musical Hamilton during its Grand Rapids run.

Pete Miller, EGRMS 8th grade social studies teacher and one of the grant writers, has been dreaming of sharing the show with his 8th grade students for years. A grant of \$9,558, funded by donors to the Foundation, made it possible. Once the Foundation grant was approved, Miller worked out a plan for families to share the cost of tickets.

To top off the experience, Miller was able to provide another unique opportunity for the 8th grade: Mikey Winslow (EGRHS '04), a Hamilton cast member, came to the middle school the morning after the show. Winslow shared his experience in the cast of Hamiton with the middle schoolers, as well as his journey from East to Broadway, and his dance comeback after a total hip replacement in 2018. The students were awestruck to see someone who had gone to their school who is now part of this landmark show. What an opportunity for our students!
