
with special needs. One of his most famous quotes is his response to someone who was bullying







"The Button Lover's Book" was published by Chilton in 1991. I then went to work as Senior Editor and Cool Hunter for Klutz Press. I wrote about a dozen books for them, including one with the Metropolitan Museum of Art. I also traveled all over the world


